

## Question #1: How long will your college remain closed?

### Do you know what their plans are for the future?

1. **Butte College**-Rest of the semester, no plans for future semesters/summer yet
2. **Butte College** - end of semester
3. **Butte College** - Chico State and Butte College are currently both suspending face to face class meetings until April 25. We do not know the schools' plans after that,
4. **City College of San Francisco** - As of now, City College of SF has been closed until the end of the term in May. All classes are to be taught using canvas, a program many have never used. That is the plan of the state chancellor if schools continue to be closed in the fall.
5. **College of the Sequoias** - The plan is to return to campus April 13th, 2020. The college seems to be taking it day by day and current plans seem very fluid and changeable.
6. **CTA** - Closed for the rest of Spring 2020. This was determined after the governor's shelter in place announcement.
7. **Cuyamaca College** - Undecided. Cuyamaca was late in announcing it would be closed and on-line the week prior to Spring Break (Spring Break being 21 March to 27 March 2020)
8. **Diablo Valley College** - It seemingly keeps changing based on county and state health authorities and the governor and the federal government decisions, but currently is April 1st or 2nd week. I have no idea what their plans are for the future, and they probably don't either.
9. **Diablo Valley College** - Indefinitely
10. **Grossmont College** - The entire semester
11. **Mesa College - SDCCD** - I do not believe that the college or the District knows. At a minimum, until the end of Spring Break. That would be three weeks - two of which would otherwise be class time.
12. **MiraCosta** - We go back to instruction (100% remotely) on 3/3/20. Yes, our AF union is aware of plans, through this semester.
13. **MiraCosta College** - Closed for one additional week creating an extended spring break for students.
14. **Napa Valley College** - Sounds like we are closed through the end of spring semester, not official yet but all indications point that direction.
15. **Rancho Santiago CCD** --All classes online indefinitely; faculty not required to be on campus
16. **Riverside CCD** - All classes online until April 30th (possibly longer); no one allowed on campuses so all training done via Zoom or YouTube
17. **San Bernardino CCD**--All classes shifted to online for remainder of semester (ends May 22nd); limited access to campus; some labs and resources will be on campus
18. **San Diego City College** - We have been told at least until 4/6, which is the end on Spring Break.

19. **San Diego City College** - 1 extra week, then 100% online.
20. **Santa Monica** - I've only seen a tentative deadline for Santa Monica College. They said they would be all online AT LEAST through mid-June. It's tough to keep up with the flurry of emails.
21. **Santa Monica** - Rest of Spring semester
22. **Shasta College** - "This is a dynamic situation." That's the basic message from all the colleges where I teach. Right now, it seems that colleges are moving in-person lecture classes to virtual meetings (email, Zoom, Canvas) for about three or four weeks. At one college, they have shifted Spring Break from April to March. One college is closing down the first part of one week for training and planning to move to virtual, then the second part of the week only originally full online will be back in session, then there is Spring Break. At another college, classes will be held the first part of the week, then the second part of the week all classes are cancelled, then the following week is Spring Break. As I write this and I went to confirm the information by reviewing yesterday's emails, I see now that this second college has announced that all classes are cancelled as of today (Tuesday) and for the rest of the week before Spring Break begins. A third college, on the quarter system, has moved the last two weeks of the Winter quarter to virtual, then Spring Break, then there will be another week of no classes and the Spring quarter will start a week late, and then the first couple of weeks of the new Spring quarter will be virtual. Beyond that, which is early to mid-April for all colleges, the plans are still to be determined based on new information.
23. **Shasta College** - Closed until March 30 and then a partial reopening for labs and other classes the online format will not work for (i.e. welding)
24. **Southwestern College** - On-line until end of the semester.
25. Until the end of the Spring semester.
26. Through the summer sessions!
